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Tips to Prevent and Thaw Frozen Pipes



If you see water running down a street, please contact the Clayton County Water Authority immediately at 770.960.5200 to report the possible line break or leak.

Being prepared and informed may help you to avoid the messy and often expensive issue of frozen pipes. The following information and suggestions can help prevent water pipes in the home from freezing, and how to thaw them if they do freeze.

Know where the main water valve shut off is for your home. This valve is often found in a crawl space or basement on the wall near the front outside spigot or in homes on a slab near the hot water heater. If you have a pipe burst inside your home, immediately close this valve to shut off the water supply and help prevent further water damage.

During Cold Weather, Take Preventative Action

- Keep garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals up out of the reach of children.
- When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - helps prevent pipes from freezing.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. By temporarily suspending the use of lower nighttime temperatures, you may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job if pipes freeze and burst.
- If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home, set to a temperature no lower than 55° F.

To Thaw Frozen Pipes

- If you turn on a faucet and only a trickle comes out, suspect a frozen pipe. Likely places for frozen pipes include against exterior walls or where your water service enters your home through the foundation.
- Keep the faucet open. As you treat the frozen pipe and the frozen area begins to melt, water will begin to flow through the frozen area. Running water through the pipe will help melt ice in the pipe.
- Apply heat to the section of pipe using an electric heating pad wrapped around the pipe, an electric hair dryer, a portable space heater (kept away from flammable materials), or by wrapping pipes with towels soaked in hot water. Do not use a blowtorch, kerosene or propane heater, charcoal stove, or other open flame device.
- Apply heat until full water pressure is restored. If you are unable to locate the frozen area, if the frozen area is not accessible, or if you cannot thaw the pipe, call a licensed plumber.
- Check all other faucets in your home to find out if you have additional frozen pipes. If one pipe freezes, others may freeze, too.

Why Pipe Freezing is a Problem

Water has a unique property in that it expands as it freezes. This expansion puts tremendous pressure on whatever is containing it, including metal or plastic pipes. No matter the "strength" of a container, expanding water can cause pipes to break. Pipes that freeze most frequently are those that are exposed to severe cold, like outdoor hose bibs, swimming pool supply lines, water sprinkler lines, and water supply pipes in unheated interior areas like basements and crawl spaces, attics, garages, or kitchen cabinets. Pipes that run against exterior walls that have little or no insulation are also subject to freezing.

Preventing Frozen Pipes

Before the onset of cold weather, prevent freezing of these water supply lines and pipes by following these recommendations:

- Drain water from swimming pool and water sprinkler supply lines following manufacturer's or installer's directions. Do not put antifreeze in these lines unless directed. Antifreeze is environmentally harmful, and is dangerous to humans, pets, wildlife, and landscaping.
- Remove, drain, and store hoses used outdoors. Close inside valves supplying outdoor hose bibs. Open the outside hose bibs to allow water to drain. Keep the outside valve open so that any water remaining in the pipe can expand without causing the pipe to break.
- Check around the home for other areas where water supply lines are located in unheated areas. Look in the basement, crawl space, attic, garage, and under kitchen and bathroom cabinets. Both hot and cold water pipes in these areas should be insulated.
- Consider installing specific products made to insulate water pipes like a "pipe sleeve" or installing UL-listed "heat tape," "heat cable," or similar materials on exposed water pipes. Newspaper can provide some degree of insulation and protection to exposed pipes – even ¼" of newspaper can provide significant protection in areas that usually do not have frequent or prolonged temperatures below freezing.

Future Protection

- Consider relocating exposed pipes to provide increased protection from freezing.
- Pipes can be relocated by a professional if the home is remodeled.
- Add insulation to attics, basements and crawl spaces. Insulation will maintain higher temperatures in these areas.

WINTER STORM SAFETY TIPS



WHAT IF MY POWER GOES OUT?



- Don't go near downed power lines.
- NEVER try to pull branches or other debris off a power line.
- Don't touch anything a power line is touching.
- Don't leave your candles unattended.
- Keep your refrigerator and freezer doors shut - they can keep food cold for up to 24 hours.
- Throw away food that has been above 40 degrees for more than 2 hours, or that has an unusual color, odor or texture.
- Turn off appliances that were running when the power went off - you don't want the stove to be on all night in case your power returns.
- Unplug electronics like TVs and computers, so that returning power does not damage them.
- Keep flammable items away from fireplaces and space heaters.
- Do not attempt to heat your home by starting a fire in anything other than your fireplace.

Federal Bonding Fact Sheet

What Is Federal Bonding?

Federal Bonding provides employers with limited liability coverage at no cost when they hire job applicants who cannot be covered by a commercial bond. A Federal Fidelity Bond from Travelers Insurance is a business policy that insures employers against theft, forgery or embezzlement by the bonded employee.

The bond does not cover liability due to poor workmanship, job injuries or work accidents. The Federal Bonding Program does not provide bail bonds, contract bonds, performance bonds or license bonds for self-employment.

Who Is Eligible?

Job applicants who fall into one of the following categories:

- Ex-offenders
- Recovering substance abusers (alcohol or drugs)
- Welfare recipients
- People with poor credit histories or who have declared bankruptcy
- Economically disadvantaged youth and adults who lack a stable work history
- Individuals dishonorably discharged from the military
- Anyone who cannot secure employment without bonding services
- Employed workers who need bonding to avoid termination or secure a promotion

Bonds can be issued as soon as the applicant has a job offer and a scheduled start date. Workers must be paid wages with federal taxes automatically deducted from pay; self-employed persons cannot be covered. However, part-time and temporary workers may be eligible.

Over 95% of bonds are issued for \$5,000 coverage for a six-month period. Coverage can be increased or extended based on the situation. When the initial bond coverage expires, employers can purchase continued bond coverage from Travelers Insurance.

1. Find a qualified job applicant - Georgia DOL can provide screened referrals if you need help.
2. Once you set a hire date, have the applicant stop by a Georgia DOL Career Center to provide hiring information.
3. Receive a confirmation email from Georgia DOL within 48 hours.
4. Receive the bond within 15 days - it will be effective on the hire date and last 6 months.
